

ACCESSIBILITY MATTERS!

WHAT DOES ACCESSIBLE PARKING MEAN?

Accessible parking permits are issued to a person or business and not a vehicle. Permit holders must be in the vehicle and the permit displayed on the dashboard in order to park in an accessible parking space.

Accessible parking spaces that serve a particular building or facility are located at the shortest accessible route from parking to an accessible entrance.

and they may be perfectly legitimate to park for other reasons. Just because somebody isn't using a wheelchair, walker or cane, doesn't mean that they don't need the accessible parking spot.

HEALTH CONDITIONS

- A person who cannot walk without assistance of another individual or of a brace, cane, crutch, lower limb prosthetic device or who requires the assistance of a wheelchair.
- A person who suffers from lung disease and carrying a portable oxygen is a medical necessity.
- A person who is severely limited in the ability to walk due to an arthritic, neurological, musculoskeletal or orthopedic condition.
- A person with visual impairment.
- A person that their mobility is severely limited by one or more conditions or functional impairments.
