
After considering a report from the CAO, Council will not signal its intent to create a Police Services Board in collaboration with the lower tier municipalities at this point.

What's Going on in our Municipal Departments?

Greater Napanee Municipal Administration Centre Project

Council directed staff to proceed with the development of a centralized, consolidated municipal service delivery model to obtain a new administrative building. A centralized building will help minimize municipal service access points, maximize administrative and operational efficiencies, and ensure long-term cost effectiveness. The centralized service model selected will follow thorough evaluation and community consultation, which will determine the best option for a growing, thriving Greater Napanee. Amending Agreement - Product Care - Municipal Industry Stewardship Plan Materials Services Agreement

Council endorsed the Amending Agreement – Product Care – Municipal ISP Materials Services Agreement at the January 11, 2022, Regular Session of Council. The updated PCA-Municipal ISP Services Agreement has been distributed to the Town for endorsement and submission. Upon submission, the Town will be eligible for funding for future Household Hazardous Waste Events. The updated Services Agreement includes various minor changes from the Town's current agreement. By-law Amendment for Proposed 2022 Taxi Rates and Fares Increase

Council reviewed the <u>public comments and supplementary staff report</u> regarding taxi fares and directed staff to further amend the Taxi Licensing by-law to allow taxi companies to set their own rates and have the Town's role be to monitor and enforce safety standards. Following a new public notice period, the proposed by-law revision will be considered by Council at the February 8 meeting.



2022 Fees for Services By-law


Council adopted <u>By-law No. 2022-01 – To Impose Fees or Changes for Services Provided, Costs Payable or Use of Property by the Town of Greater Napanee</u>. Fee increases are in effect for marriage licences, new advertisements on the ice surfacers wrap at the Strathcona Paper Centre and some rate increases and new rates created for Fire Services. These new fees are available on the <u>Facilities and Service Fees page</u> of the Town's website.

What's Coming Up - New Business

Council requested a staff report to the February 22 meeting to provide options on changing section 4.38 of the Zoning By-law, which limits parking of camper trailers on residential driveways. The report has been asked to look at:

- Options for allowing trailers to be parked in residential driveways during the camping months; and
- Options to grant a 48-hour extension, by permit, for trailer owners to park overhanging the sidewalk up to twice a year to assist with bringing trailers in and out of storage.

Between July 2021 – November 2021, the Town partnered with the Municipality of Brighton on a <u>First Impressions Community Exchange (FICE) initiative through OMAFRA</u>. The presentation from Brighton on its first impressions of the Greater Napanee community was presented at the January 11, 2022, regular session of Council. The feedback provided in Brighton's report will be considered by staff as input when developing Greater Napanee's updated Strategic Plan.

Council proclaimed February 13, 2022, as Wear Red Day in Greater Napanee to raise awareness of women's cardiovascular health. The official proclamation will be available on the Town's website.

On September 15, 2021, a drinking water inspection was conducted within the Sandhurst Shores Drinking Water System. On October 6, 2021, a drinking water inspection was conducted within the A.L. Dafoe (Napanee) Drinking Water System. The inspections were conducted by an area Drinking Water Inspector and included a physical inspection of the water treatment plants, discussions with Drinking Water Operators and a detailed document review. The A.L. Dafoe and Sandhurst Shores Drinking Water Systems received Final Inspection Ratings of 100% during the 2021/2022 Inspection period, with no noncompliance issues or actions required.

At this time of year Greater Napanee Fire Services would like to remind residents of the dangers associated with water and ice. Conditions may change rapidly depending on air temperatures and water currents. Always use extreme caution near or on the water.
