

Town of Greater Napanee Council Highlights

Regular Meeting of Council for August 29, 2023

Municipal Facility Allocation Policy

Council adopted the <u>Municipal Facility Allocation Policy</u> which <u>will standardize all procedures</u> pertaining to rentals, payments, and cancellations at municipal facilities. The <u>policy will also</u> ensure facility payment schedules be adhered to, eliminating outstanding accounts.

Proposed Partnership with Deseronto Transit

Council authorized the <u>partnership</u> between the Town of Greater Napanee and the Town of Deseronto (Deseronto Transit) to provide a coordinated transportation service that will benefit both municipalities. A proposal will be submitted to Lennox and Addington County that will commit the Town of Greater Napanee and Town of Deseronto to provide a service generally described within the proposed transportation project.



Community Improvement Project Area

Council passed By-Law #2023-0056 to designate the municipality as a Community Improvement Project Area. CIPs are designed to attract and retain businesses and to encourage investment or reinvestment at greenfield and existing sites. CIP objectives are generally intended to increase employment, enhance property assessment and economic activity, encourage land sales, and to take advantage of existing private and public infrastructure. The Town will be drafting a Community Improvement Plan (CIP) over the coming months that will be geared towards attracting new industrial development. It is anticipated the CIP will be in-effect by year end.

Draft Reserve Policy

Council received for information a report on the <u>Draft Reserve Policy</u>. A decision on the Draft Reserve Policy will be deferred to the September 26th meeting to allow additional time for review of the PUC Reserve and other proposed reserve policies.

Procedure By-law Update


Council reviewed a draft update to the <u>Council meeting procedures by-law</u>. The proposed by-law will be brought back on September 12th for adoption, and will go into effect for the September 26th meeting of Council.

Proposed Licensing By-law for Mobile Food Vendors

Council discussed the staff report about a proposed Mobile Food Vendor Licensing By-law. Based on the discussion during the meeting, staff will be drafting a new by-law which will be presented to Council this fall for further discussion, with the by-law planned to go into effect for January 1st. The proposed by-law will allow food trucks to operate in more commercial zones, will open up the potential for more municipal leases, and will require annual licenses to include proof that the vendors are in good standing with provincial health and safety agencies.
