

**THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GREATER NAPANEE  
BY-LAW NO. 2026-0023**

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**A By-law to Regulate the Use of the Waste Management System for the Town of  
Greater Napanee**

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**WHEREAS** Sections 8, 9 and 10 of the *Municipal Act, 2001*, authorize a municipality to pass by-laws that are necessary or desirable for municipal purposes and, in particular, respecting economic, social and environmental well-being of the municipality including climate change; health, safety and wellbeing of persons; services and things that the municipality is authorized to provide; and protection of persons and property;

**AND WHEREAS** Section 391 of the *Municipal Act, 2001* provides that a municipality may pass by-laws imposing fees or charges on persons for services or activities provided or done by or on behalf of it;

**AND WHEREAS** Council of the Town of Greater Napanee wishes to regulate the use of the Town's waste management system;

**NOW THEREFORE** the Council of The Town of Greater Napanee enacts as follows:

**PART 1 – DEFINITIONS**

1.1 In this By-law,

- a) **“Authorized Distributor”** shall mean the Municipality, or a business approved by the Municipality that has agreed to sell Bag Tags on such terms and conditions as may be established by the Municipality from time to time;
- b) **“Bag Tag”** shall mean an identification marker as authorized by Council and designated for use on Refuse Containers;
- c) **“Brush”** means woody materials (twigs, branches, etc.).
- d) **“Christmas Trees”** means natural Christmas trees (as opposed to artificial trees) and other material as designated by the Town from time to time.
- e) **“Collectible”** means waste which may be collected pursuant to this by-law.
- f) **“Common Collection Point”** means a collection point for curbside collection by two (2) or more Residential Units or properties, often being

located along public roads, near private roads or at multi-unit residential buildings, subject to any requirements of the Town's Encroachment By-law as adopted or amended from time to time.

- g) **“Council”** means the Council of the Town of Greater Napanee.
- h) **“Curbside”** means the collection area directly in front of an Owner's premises as close as possible to the travelled portion of the public road without obstructing or interfering with the travelled portion of the road or any sidewalk.
- i) **“Designated Collection Day”** means the specific day or days established for the curbside collection of approved waste as published in the Town's collection schedule or as otherwise communicated to residents.
- j) **“Household Hazardous Waste”** means any household product, material or item labeled as 'corrosive', 'reactive', 'explosive', 'toxic' or 'flammable' including, but not limited to, the following:
  - i. Chemicals: pool or photographic chemicals, laundry bleach, drain, oven, toilet and carpet cleaning solutions, ammonia, medicines and prescription drugs, paint thinner and paint remover;
  - ii. Pesticides & Herbicides: weed killers, fungicides, rat poison, Malathion, parathion, moth balls, flea killers;
  - iii. Paints: wood preservatives, acrylic and latex paints, turpentines, varsol and other solvents, nail polish;
  - iv. Oils & Grease: engine oil, brake and transmission fluid, anti-freeze, gasoline or kerosene;
  - v. Batteries: automotive batteries, nickel-cadmium rechargeable batteries;
  - vi. Ammunition: fireworks;
  - vii. Compressed gas cylinders: propane tanks and
  - viii. Light bulbs and lighting ballasts.
- k) **“IC&I”** means industrial, commercial, and institutional premises.
- l) **“Large Items”** means any oversized normal household waste which is not classified as domestic waste and includes items such as furniture, appliances, mattresses, bicycle frames, electronic equipment, fencing (posts removed), as well as white goods including washers, dryers, stoves, refrigerators and freezers. "Large Items" does not include construction or demolition waste, boats, snowmobiles, machine parts, auto parts, tree stumps, hazardous waste, propane tanks or the like.
- m) **“Leaf/Yard Waste”** means leaves, grass, weeds, trimmings, and other material as designated by the Town from time to time, but does not

include brush.

- n) **"Non-Eligible Sources"** means sources of recycling that are not residential in nature, with respect to Circular Materials Ontario's responsibility in municipal recycling services. These include sources from Commercial properties and businesses, Daycares, Places of Worship, Non-profit or charitable organizations, Commercial farms, Institutions, Seasonal Trailer Parks & Campgrounds, Municipal & Government buildings and industrial properties.
- o) **"Refuse"** means any solid non-hazardous waste, but shall not include any item described in Schedule "A" of this by-law;
- p) **"Residential Dwelling Unit"** means one or more habitable rooms designed for use by and occupied by not more than one family and in which separate kitchen and sanitary facilities are provided for the exclusive use of such a family, with a private entrance from outside the building or from a common hallway or stairway inside the building.
- q) **"Scavenge"** means search for useable objects or material within any waste streams at curbside or any waste disposal site.
- r) **"Town"** means the Town of Greater Napanee or an authorized representative of the Town of Greater Napanee.
- s) **"Waste Container"** means a waterproof bag, bundle, receptacle, can or such other container as may be approved from time to time by the Town for the storing and setting out of waste and includes the following:
  - i. "Leaf/Yard Waste Container" means a brown paper bag or such other container as may be approved from time to time by the Town for the storing and setting out of leaf/yard waste.
  - ii. "Recyclables Container" means a container commonly known as a "Blue Box", "Recycling Cart", "Recycling Bag" or such other container as may be approved from time to time by the Town for the storing and setting out of recyclables.
  - iii. "Refuse Container" means a container approved from time to time by the Town for the storing and setting out of Refuse.
- t) **"Waste Disposal Site"** means (pursuant to the Environmental Protection Act, R.S.O. 1990, c.E.19 as amended):
  - i. any land owned by the Town upon, into, in or through which, or building or structure in which, waste is deposited, disposed of, handled, stored, transferred, treated or processed, and

- ii. any operation carried out or machinery or equipment used in connection with the depositing, disposal, handling, storage, transfer, treatment or processing referred to in clause (a).

## **PART 2 – SETTING OUT WASTE FOR COLLECTION**

### **General Provisions**

- 2.1 No person shall set out or permit to be set out waste for collection as part of the Town's Waste Management System except as provided for in this by-law.
- 2.2 The owner or occupant of a premises shall set out for collection only the classes of waste, only at the locations, only in the manner, and only in accordance with the schedules of collection days and times, all as established by the Town from time to time.
- 2.3 The owner or occupant of a premises shall set out for collection only such waste as is collectible, as designated by the Town from time to time.
- 2.4 The classes of collectible waste are:
  - a) Brush;
  - b) Christmas Trees;
  - c) Leaf/Yard Waste;
  - d) Collectible recyclables, under the responsibility of Circular Materials Ontario (Note: this service is only available for eligible sources as defined in the Blue Box Regulation (Ontario Regulation 391/21: Blue Box));
  - e) Collectible Refuse, as set out in Schedule "A" to this by-law.
- 2.5 The owner or occupant of a premises shall place Collectible items only at the Curbside or Common Collection Point.
- 2.6 The Town may, from time to time, designate which classes of waste are collectible from which types of premises, located in which areas of the Town.
- 2.7 The owner or occupant of a premises shall set out waste for collection by placing it in front of the premises of that owner or occupant, and as close as possible to the travelled portion of the public road without obstructing the travelled portion of the road or any sidewalk.
- 2.8 The owner or occupant of a premises shall ensure that Waste Containers are:
  - a) maintained in a condition which is safe and efficient for collection;
  - b) bound, if necessary, to prevent spillage or breakage during collection; and
  - c) sealed, if necessary, to prevent the attraction of animals (including insects) and the release of odours.

- 2.9 The owner or occupant of a premises shall not permit waste set out for collection from that premises to become unsecured for any reason, including weather or animals.
- 2.10 The owner or occupant of a premises shall immediately clean up and re-secure waste if it becomes unsecured.
- 2.11 Every person shall set out Waste not earlier than 6:00 p.m. on the day before the Designated Collection Day, and not later than 7:00 a.m. on the Designated Collection Day.
- 2.12 The owner or occupant of a premises shall remove Waste Containers set out by such owner or occupant of such premises, together with any waste that was not collected for any reason, from the road allowance as soon as possible after collection, and not later than 7:00 p.m. on the Designated Collection Day. If the occupant is unable or unwilling to comply with this, the responsibility will default to the owner.
- 2.13 If the owner or occupant of a premises fails to keep the premises clean and free of waste to the satisfaction of the Director of Environmental Services or Designate, the Director of Environmental Services or Designate may refuse to continue waste collection from the premises until such time as the premises is cleaned to the satisfaction of the Director of Environmental Services or Designate. If the occupant is unable or unwilling to comply with this, the responsibility will default to the owner.
- 2.14 No person shall scavenge, interfere with, disturb, remove or scatter any waste set out for collection.
- 2.15 If collection service is available to a premises for any one or more of brush, Christmas Trees, Leaf/Yard Waste, Recyclables or Refuse, then the following provisions relevant to that class of waste shall also apply.
- 2.16 There shall be no collection on private roads with the exception of Unger Island Road, Meadow Lane, and the roads contained within the Richmond Trailer Park.
- 2.17 Residents on private roads are to take waste to the curbside of the nearest public road.
- 2.18 No person shall set out Refuse, Brush, waste or other items for collection not generated within the Municipality

## **Setting out Brush**

- 2.19 When setting out Brush for collection, every person shall ensure it is:
- a) packaged in bundles (each individual piece of material not to exceed 7 cm. (2.8 in.) in diameter) with each bundle not exceeding:
    - i. a size of 1.5 m. (5.0 ft.) long by 0.5 m. (1.6 ft.) wide; and
    - ii. a weight of 18 kg. (40 lb.);
  - b) separated by at least 1.2 m. (4 ft.) from any other class of waste set out for collection;
  - c) a maximum quantity of 2.5 cubic meters (88 cubic feet), the approximate load size of a half-ton pickup truck, at the discretion of the Town employee collecting the waste;
  - d) only on the collection days and times as established by the Town from time to time; and
  - e) in the rural areas, only after notifying the Town.

### **Setting out Christmas Trees**

- 2.20 When setting out Christmas Trees for collection, every person shall ensure the Christmas Trees are:
- a) without wrapping, bagging, decorations or lights;
  - b) separated by at least 1.2 m. (4 ft.) from any other class of waste set out for collection;
  - c) set out only on the collection days and times as established by the Town from time to time; and
  - d) in the rural areas, only set out after notifying the Town.

### **Setting out Leaf/Yard Waste**

- 2.21 When setting out Leaf/Yard Waste for collection, every person shall ensure it is:
- a) packaged in a Leaf/Yard Waste Container not exceeding:
    - i. a size of 90 cm. (36 in.) in height by 60 cm. (24 in.) in diameter; and
    - ii. a weight (of container and leaf/yard waste) of 18 kg. (40 lb.);
  - b) separated by at least 1.2 m. (4 ft.) from any other class of waste set out for collection;
  - c) a maximum quantity of 2.5 cubic meters (88 cubic feet), the approximate load size of a half-ton pickup truck, at the discretion of the Town employee collecting the waste;
  - d) set out only on the collection days and times as established by the Town from time to time; and
  - e) in the rural areas, set out only after notifying the Town.

### **Setting out Refuse**

- 2.22 When setting out Refuse for collection, every person shall ensure it is:
- a) packaged in a Refuse Container not exceeding:

- i. a size of 90 cm. (36 in.) in height by 60 cm (24 in.) in diameter or a capacity of 125 litres; and
- ii. a weight (of container and waste) of 18 kg. (40 lb.);
- b) with the relevant Bag Tag affixed; and
- c) separated by at least 1.2 m. (4 ft.) from any other class of waste set out for collection.

2.23 The maximum number of Refuse Containers which may be set out for collection shall not exceed three (3) per collection for each residential dwelling unit or five (5) per collection for each building used for one or more institutional, commercial or industrial purposes.

2.24 An owner or occupant may set out for collection the maximum number of Refuse Containers specified above, provided that each such Refuse Container has the appropriate Bag Tag affixed.

2.25 The Town reserves the right to inspect the common collection points and cause the owner(s) to clean it to the satisfaction of the Town.

2.26 Failure to maintain a common collection point may result in its removal or discontinued collection until the issues are resolved.

2.27 The fee for each Bag Tag is shown in the Town's Fees and Charges By-law, as amended from time to time, which shall be paid in advance to the Town. The payment of such fee shall be made by the purchase from the Town or an Authorized Distributor of Bag Tags in multiples of 5.

2.28 Such Bag Tags shall be affixed as follows:

- a) for a disposable Refuse Container, in a clearly visible location; and
- b) for a non-disposable Refuse Container, on the Refuse inside the container in a clearly visible location readily seen upon removal of the container's lid or top.

2.29 The use of or creation of counterfeit Bag Tags is strictly prohibited.

- a) No person shall cause or permit Refuse to be placed for collection with a counterfeit Bag Tag.
- b) No person or entity shall cause or permit the sale or creation of counterfeit Bag Tags.

### **Setting out Items for "Giveaway Day"**

2.30 "Giveaway Day" shall be held on Earth Day or the Saturday closest to April 22<sup>nd</sup>; and the second Saturday each September.

2.31 "Giveaway Day" items shall be set out for collection:  
a) no earlier than 7:00 am on the day of collection;

- b) clearly labeled as "FREE"; and
- c) unclaimed items must be removed by 7:00 pm on the same day.

2.32 The Town is not responsible for collecting unclaimed items.

### **PART 3 – DEPOSIT OF WASTE**

#### **General**

- 3.1 No person shall cause or permit waste to be swept, thrown, cast or otherwise deposited on or in any road or public property, except in accordance with this by-law.
- 3.2 No person shall cause or permit waste to be blown, dropped or dumped from a premises or vehicle owned or operated by that person on or in any road or public property, except in accordance with this by-law.
- 3.3 No person shall cause or permit any waste generated on a premises owned or occupied by that person, to be placed in or around litter bins on any road or public property.
- 3.4 No person shall scavenge or remove any waste from a Waste Disposal Site unless it has been designated for removal by the public or the written permission of the Town has been given.
- 3.5 Tipping fees for the deposit of waste at a Waste Disposal Site are shown in Schedule "B", as may be amended from time to time.

#### **Access to the Town's Waste Disposal Sites**

- 3.6 No person shall access a Waste Disposal Site outside of the times shown in Schedule "C", as may be amended from time to time.
- 3.7 Access to a Waste Disposal Site when it is closed is only possible with special permission of the Director of Environmental Services or Designate.
- 3.8 Access to a Waste Disposal Site shall be limited to residents of the Town of Greater Napanee who provide proof of residency to deposit waste generated and collected from within the Town of Greater Napanee.
- 3.9 No waste shall be accepted from commercial business or commercial waste haulers.
- 3.10 Section 3.9 does not apply to Non-Eligible Sources for the purpose of disposing of recycling at the Site.

3.11 The Town may specify time schedules and pre-deposit conditions for persons seeking access to a Waste Disposal Site.

3.12 The Director of Environmental Services or Designate may refuse access to a person if in the Town's opinion:

- a) the person has violated this by-law;
- b) the person is likely to violate this by-law;
- c) the person owes money to the Town pursuant to this by-law;
- d) the person is transporting material which is unacceptable for deposit at a Waste Disposal Site;
- e) the person's vehicle's load is not fully covered and/or secured; or
- f) the person's vehicle appears to be unsafe.

3.13 No person shall enter unlawfully a Waste Disposal Site at any time.

### **Depositing Material at the Town's Waste Disposal Sites**

3.14 Every person depositing material at a Waste Disposal Site shall deposit only such types of materials that are acceptable for deposit at that Site, as designated by the Town from time to time. None of the materials as set out in Schedule "D" shall be accepted at the Town's Waste Disposal Sites.

3.15 Every person depositing material at a Waste Disposal Site shall:

- a) comply with all orders or directions given by the Site attendant, for example regarding vehicle routes and designated unloading areas;
- b) bring waste-hauling vehicles to a complete stop and await the direction of the Site attendant before entering or leaving the Site;
- c) obey all speed limits and other signs posted at the Site;
- d) ensure that all waste brought onto the Site is in properly covered leak-proof containers and totally enclosed or covered in canvas, tarpaulins or nets so fastened down around the edges as to prevent any of the contents from falling to the ground, attracting flies or vermin, or releasing excessive offensive odours;
- e) remove or release tarpaulins and turnbuckles on waste-hauling vehicles only in the designated unloading area;
- f) deposit waste only within the area of the Waste Disposal Site designated for such waste;
- g) remove any remaining loose material from truck boxes before leaving the designated unloading areas;
- h) close and secure (with chains or alternative measures acceptable to the Town) all unloading doors on waste-hauling vehicles before leaving the designated unloading areas;
- i) ensure that no person or animal (other than any person twelve years of age or older required to unload a waste-hauling vehicle) exits from the

- vehicle in the designated unloading area;
- j) enter the Site at the person's own risk;
- k) together with the owner of any waste-hauling vehicle brought upon the Site by the person, save the Town, its contractors, agents and employees harmless from any damage or claims whatsoever to themselves or their property or to any other person or property whatsoever arising from such person's negligence or otherwise;
- l) not depart the Site until the relevant tipping fee as set by the Town from time to time is paid in full by cash;
- m) conform strictly to all requirements of the *Environmental Protection Act*, the *Occupational Health and Safety Act* and any other relevant legislation, any relevant regulations thereunder, any relevant Certificates of Approval and any relevant Town Policies and Procedures;
- n) immediately remove such material at the person's own expense if it is unacceptable for deposit pursuant to this by-law; and
- o) not deposit or cause or permit to be deposited any material at the entrance to or around the perimeter of a Waste Disposal Site of the Town.

### **Household Hazardous Waste Drop Off**

- 3.16 No person shall deposit or permit to be deposited any Household Hazardous Waste on or in any road or public property, except on the specific collection days and times and at the specific locations designated by the Town from time to time.
- 3.17 Access to the drop off location for Household Hazardous Waste shall be limited to persons who have provided proof of residency satisfactory to the Town and only for Household Hazardous Waste generated and collected from within the Town.

### **PART 4 – ENFORCEMENT**

- 4.1 No Person shall obstruct an Officer in the exercise of an authority pursuant to this By-law.
- 4.2 Where an Officer has reasonable grounds to believe that an offence under this By-law has been committed by a Person, the Officer may require the name, address, and proof of identity of that Person.
- 4.3 Failure to provide proof of identification satisfactory to an Officer when requested to do so shall constitute obstruction of an Officer under Section 4.1 of this By-law.
- 4.4 An offence and subsequent conviction under this by-law shall not be deemed in any way to preclude the Town from commencing a separate legal proceeding to recover charges, costs and expenses incurred by the Town.
- 4.5 Service of an Order to Comply under this By-law shall be carried out by personal service or registered mail. Where notification is by personal service, it may be

served upon any owner or occupier of the property and shall be deemed to have been served at the time of personal service. Where notification is by registered mail, it is deemed to have been served 3 days after the day the registered letter was mailed.

- 4.6 No Person shall fail to comply with an Order to Comply issued pursuant to this By-law.

## **PART 5 - GENERAL**

- 5.1. That this by-law shall be cited as the “Solid Waste By-law”.
- 5.2. Where a provision of this by-law conflicts with a provision of another by-law in force in the Town, the provisions that establish the higher standards to protect the health, safety and welfare of the general public shall prevail.
- 5.3. The schedules to this by-law form an integral part of this by-law.
- 5.4. When any provision of this by-law is declared invalid for any reason by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the by-law shall still continue in force.
- 5.5. All terms used in this by-law which have not been defined in this by-law shall be given the meanings provided for such terms in the *Environmental Protection Act* and the regulations thereunder.
- 5.6. The provisions of this by-law shall be subject to the terms of the Certificates of Approval for any Waste Disposal Site or any other waste management facilities or systems operated by or on behalf of the Town, and any relevant statutes and regulations.
- 5.7. That By-law 2006-0014 and its amending by-laws are hereby repealed on the date this by-law comes into effect.
- 5.8. This by-law shall come into force and take effect on the date it is passed.

Read a first and second time and finally passed this 24<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2026.

## TOWN OF GREATER NAPANEE

### Schedule “A” of By-law 2026-0023: to Regulate the Use of the Waste Management System for the Town of Greater Napanee

#### Collectible Refuse

1. All Refuse is collectible except the following:
  - a. Recyclables;
  - b. Large Items;
  - c. Household Hazardous Waste;
  - d. Construction and demolition materials, including bricks, blocks, stones, plaster and other building materials from renovation, construction or demolition activities;
  - e. Clearing and grubbing materials including dirt, tree stumps, trunks and large branches, rocks, etc;
  - f. Hazardous waste, as defined in Ontario Regulation 347, R.R.O. 1990, or any succeeding regulation, under the *Environmental Protection Act*;
  - g. Motor vehicles or automotive parts including truck and automobile tires;
  - h. Live animals or fowl and carcasses or parts thereof of any animal or other creature, save for normal and bona fide kitchen organic waste, which have been drained of all liquids;
  - i. Materials of any kind or nature that contain hot live coals or fire, including ashes and explosive or highly combustible materials such as oil-soaked or gasoline- soaked rags, ignited ashes, or other waste capable of starting fires;
  - j. Septic or holding tank pumpings or raw sewage;
  - k. Open, empty metal drums or barrels and sealed metal drums or barrels;
  - l. Any material which has become frozen to the container and cannot be removed by shaking;
  - m. Gaseous or semi-liquid or liquid waste including liquid industrial waste as defined in Ontario Regulation 347, R.R.O. 1990 or any succeeding regulation under the *Environmental Protection Act*;
  - n. Biosolids or industrial process sludge, industrial waste and any wholesaler/retailer stock;
  - o. Hay/straw, agricultural wastes;
  - p. Biomedical or pathological waste, as defined and regulated in Ontario Regulation 347, R.R.O. 1990, or any succeeding regulation, under the Environmental Protection Act, including solid and liquid waste materials or substances which contain or could contain pathogen bacteria or micro-organisms that may be hazardous or dangerous;
  - q. Other material as designated in the relevant Certificate of Approval;
  - r. Other material as designated by the Town from time to time.

## TOWN OF GREATER NAPANEE

### Schedule “B” of By-law 2026-0023: to Regulate the Use of the Waste Management System for the Town of Greater Napanee

#### Tipping Fees for the Town’s Waste Disposal and Transfer Sites

The below noted fees will apply to all non-commercial waste that is generated from a residence within The Town of Greater Napanee, to be disposed of at the South Fredericksburgh Waste Disposal Site and/or the Roblin Waste Transfer Station.

1. All residential household domestic waste packaged in a Refuse Container not exceeding:
  - A size of 36 inches in height by 24 inches in diameter or a container with a capacity of 27.5 gallons (125 litres).

**Charge:** \$6.00; or a Greater Napanee Bag Tag plus an additional \$2.00.  
Oversized bags/containers of domestic waste will be charged an additional bag.

2. All residential bulky waste shall be calculated at a rate of \$0.45 cents per cubic foot:
  - A minimum fee of \$15.00 will be applied to all loads under 32 cubic feet.
  - Measurements will be based upon the site attendant’s discretion and will be calculated based upon the greatest vertical and horizontal measurements.

**Formula:** (Length x Width x Height) will determine the quantity in cubic feet to be multiplied by \$0.45. All fees will be rounded to the nearest dollar.

3. Additional surcharges will be applied to all residential Large Items as per below:
  - \$10.00 for each item (i.e. box spring, mattress, sofas/chairs, cabinetry, dressers, and other accepted items that are not broken down).
4. The following recyclable items are accepted at both the South Fredericksburgh Waste Disposal Site and the Roblin Waste Disposal Site free of charge:
  - Electronic waste
  - Scrap metal
  - Biodegradable bagged leaves & yard compost
  - Brush less than 3 inch in diameter
5. Any charitable or non-profit organization wanting to use the site(s) free of charge shall apply for a grant through the Town’s Clerk’s office.
6. Recyclable items are accepted at both South Fredericksburgh Waste Disposal Site and Roblin Waste Disposal Site. Which specific recyclables materials that are collected are at the discretion of Circular Materials Ontario.

Both of the Town's Waste Disposal Sites are closed all Holidays, should they fall on a normal operating date.

### Schedule “D” of By-law 2026-0023: to Regulate the Use of the Waste Management System for the Town of Greater Napanee

#### Waste Not Accepted at Town's Waste Disposal Sites

The following waste is not accepted at either of the Town's Waste Disposal Sites:

1. Household Hazardous Waste;
2. Roofing materials including shingles and tar paper;
3. Concrete;
4. Asphalt;
5. Hazardous waste, as defined in Ontario Regulation 347, R.R.O. 1990, or any succeeding regulation, under the *Environmental Protection Act*;
6. Motor vehicles or automotive parts including truck and automobile tires;
7. Live animals or fowl and carcasses or parts thereof of any animal or other creature, save for normal and bona fide kitchen organic waste, which have been drained of all liquids;
8. Materials of any kind or nature that contain hot live coals or fire, including ashes and explosive or highly combustible materials such as oil-soaked or gasoline-soaked rags, ignited ashes, or other waste capable of starting fires;
9. Septic or holding tank pumpings or raw sewage;
10. Sealed metal drums or barrels;
11. Any material which has become frozen to the container and cannot be removed by shaking;
12. Gaseous or semi-liquid or liquid waste including liquid industrial waste as defined in Ontario Regulation 347, R.R.O. 1990 or any succeeding regulation under the *Environmental Protection Act*;
13. Biosolids or industrial process sludge, industrial waste and any wholesaler/retailer stock;
14. Hay/straw, agricultural wastes;
15. Biomedical or pathological waste, as defined and regulated in Ontario Regulation 347, R.R.O. 1990, or any succeeding regulation, under the *Environmental Protection Act*, including solid and liquid waste materials or substances which contain or could contain pathogen bacteria or micro-organisms that may be hazardous or dangerous;
16. Other material as designated in the relevant Environmental Compliance Approval;
17. Boats or boat motors;
18. Whole hot tubs;
19. Other materials as designated by the Town from time to time.
