### Development Charges Background Study Update

The update to the Development Charges Background Study brings the Town's growth-related capital program up to date, aligns it with the WPCP financial plan, and incorporates recent Provincial legislative changes into a single, streamlined by-law. It also ensures that growth infrastructure needs are accurately reflected in the rates before Council, supporting a defensible and forward-looking funding strategy.



### Indoor Recreation Facility Deputation Follow-Up

Council recommended that the next term of Council's Mayor consider including a feasibility study for an indoor recreation facility in the 2027 budget deliberations. Staff were directed to begin preparation of a tender package should the next Council wish to move forward with the project.



### Spring 2026 Community Initiatives Fund Recommendations

Council approved the recommendations provided by the Community Initiatives Fund Advisory Committee. Funding for the first intake of 2026 will be provided to Old Hay Bay Church for \$1,946.05, Selby United Church for \$1,000.00, St. Alban's Centre for \$3,439.45, and the Lennox Agricultural Society for \$2,548.15. Any remaining funds from the spring intake will be rolled over to the fall intake.



### Community Event Application - Block Party Kick Off Event

Council approved the Block Party Kick Off event in accordance with the Community Events Policy. The Block Party Kick Off is a free community event celebrating the launch of Greater Napanee Connect's new Block Party Kit Program. The program is designed to help residents host neighbourhood gatherings, street parties, road hockey tournaments, community bonfires, and other activities that bring neighbours together.
