Did you know? Mandatory Alcohol Screening (MAS) is a legal procedure in Canada that allows police officers to demand a roadside breath sample from any driver they lawfully stop—even if there is no suspicion that the driver has consumed alcohol.

The Detachment welcomes a new member to the Mobile Crisis Response Team (MCRT) team. The MCRT respond with police to police received calls where individuals may be facing a mental health crisis.

In 2024 MCRT received over 4,000 contacts or actions. They personally followed up with 1,200 individuals facing mental health issues and responded to 2,500 phone calls or texts from persons seeking assistance.
