O.M.A.P. Program

The OPP Detachment introduced the **Offender Management Apprehension Program (O.M.A.P.)**. This is a crime suppression program which aims to identify offenders deemed to be high-risk to the safety of communities and individuals by ensuring they comply with the conditions of their release.

L&A OPP recently completed the hiring of two O.M.A.P. Coordinators. The O.M.A.P.

Coordinators will identify offenders who are on judicial release and permitted to reside in the community. They will also review warrant files, and ensure the apprehension efforts taken are documented.

Join the OPP Auxiliary Program!

The OPP is currently hiring for the OPP Auxiliary Unit:

- Applicants must successfully complete and eight-day Auxiliary Recruit Training Course
- Applicants must commit 10 hours/month for patrol and 6 hours/month for training
- This is a volunteer position, and is unpaid

Sign-up for CAMSAFE

Residents are encouraged to sign up for the **CAMSAFE** program, which aims to create a database of the **locations** of private security cameras in the province. If you have a security camera in your home, or business, you can register the camera [here](#).
