

Town of Greater Napanee Council Highlights

Regular Meeting of Council for February 27, 2024

Proposed Sale of Surplus Property to Algonquin Lakeshore Catholic District School Board Council rescinded resolution 357/22 and voted to remove the Marilyn Avenue property from the surplus property list. The complete <u>report</u> is available on the February 27th agenda.

Proposed Amendments to Flag and Proclamation Policies

Council received a <u>report</u> for information on the proposed amendments to the Flag and Proclamation Policies. Council adopted the draft Flag Protocol Policy Update and draft Proclamation Policy Update as presented.

Water Pollution Control Plant (WPCP) Project Update

Council received a <u>report</u> for information on the major equipment preselection and financial options for the Water Pollution Control Plant (WPCP) Project. Council authorized staff to enter into Supplier Equipment Engagement Agreements, as noted below, for a combined sum of \$200,047, excluding HST;

- 1. Claro Environmental Technologies & Equipment \$50,747 (screens/grit removal)
- 2. Huber Technology Ltd. \$19,300 (waste sludge thickener)
- 3. Aqua Aerobics Systems Inc. \$35,000 (tertiary filters)
- 4. Trojan Technologies Group ULC \$95,000 (UV disinfection)

Council directed staff to present a detailed financial strategy options report to Council after the funding



announcement release for the Provincial Housing Enabling Water Systems Fund. Staff were also directed to investigate a potential Development Charges Background Study and By-Law update based upon current probable construction costs for the WPCP.

Accidental Water Leak Adjustment Policy



Community & Corporate Services

Areas of discussion included ongoing budget preparation that is set to be approved at the next council meeting, 2023 year end procedures that are ongoing, and accounts payable listings from January 1st - February 15th, 2024.
