



Are you running for Mayor or Deputy Mayor of the Town of Greater Napanee?

Both the Mayor and Deputy Mayor automatically become members of Lennox and Addington County Council. Here's a brief overview to help you know what to expect as a County Councillor.

County Council meetings are held at least once a month on a Wednesday beginning either at 6:00 or 6:30 pm.

Members of County Council are also appointed to Committees. These include:

Southeast Public Health Board

- 1 representative
- Meetings take place on the fourth Wednesday of the month

Lennox and Addington Economic Development Coalition

- 2 representatives plus the Warden
- Meetings take place on an as required (ad-hoc) basis

Prince Edward - Lennox and Addington Social Services Committee

- 2 representatives plus the Warden
- Meetings take place approximately six times per year

Joint Accessibility Advisory Committee

- 2 representatives
- Meetings take place two to three times per year

Amrize Community Liaison Committee

- 1 representative
- Meetings take place every second or third month, more frequently when issues arise

County Councillors have four important roles to fulfill which can be briefly described as follows:

- Representing the public.
- Making policies.
- Overseeing the implementation of policies.
- Overseeing the management of resources.

Important Services the County Provides



Emergency Services

- Provides land ambulance and community paramedicine services, and coordinates emergency management and planning activities for the County.



Library Services

- Connects residents of Lennox & Addington with opportunities for lifelong learning by supporting 21st-century literacies, cultural vitality, and community engagement. Operates branches in Amherstview, Napanee, Tamworth, Bath, and Yarker.



Long Term Care Services

- The John M. Parrott Centre is an inclusive long term care home, where residents are cared for with dignity, respect, empathy and safety; provided by knowledgeable staff, in a home-like environment, while respecting the identity of residents and their quality of life.



Museum and Archives

- Preserves and shares the stories of Lennox & Addington through programs, exhibits, and lectures that educate and entertain residents and visitors alike.



Provincial Offences (POA)

- Administers Provincial Offences for Lennox & Addington, including the processing and collection of fines issued by the OPP and other enforcement agencies. Most offences fall under the Highway Traffic Act, as well as environmental and health and safety regulations, some carrying significant penalties.



Roads & Bridges

- Maintains a significant transportation network across Lennox & Addington, spanning 2,777 km from Lake Ontario in the south to the Renfrew County boundary in the north, ensuring safe travel for residents and visitors.



Social Services (PELASS)

- Prince Edward-Lennox and Addington Social Services (PELASS) serves as the Consolidated Municipal Service Manager for Lennox & Addington and Prince Edward Counties, delivering Ontario Works, Children's Services, and Housing Services.
